

WBFSH Annual Plan 2026

- 1. Develop a Strategy for Equine Welfare and Good Breeding Practice
- 2. Promoting traceability of genetic material, including recording of breeding techniques in passports and working with legislative bodies
- 3. Develop a forum to inform and evaluate how various innovative biotechnologies such as OPU-ICSI, gene modification and other potential future technologies will impact breeding
- 4. Develop the WBFSH Data Platform
- 5. To finalise implementation of suitable platforms that will provide clean, verified pedigree data, to enable data exchange with the FEI
- 6. Planning of the championships together with FEI
- 7. Planning of the studbook team competition in jumping
- 8. Working on EU legislation in cooperation with European Horse Network and other organisations
- 9. Improve overall communication between the WBFSH and its studbooks and their breeders through implementation of the marketing and communications plan
- 10. Continue to improve overall collaboration between the WBFSH and FEI, for example through the WBFSH FEI Council, for example on issues such as welfare and young horse competitions
- 11. Verified breeding information on starting lists and other media
- 12. Sponsorships work on attracting additional sponsors
- 13. Contact to international federations (COPA, EAAP etc)
- 14. Continued support of international organisation of young breeders' competition
- 15. Promote and maintain the WBFSH rankings of horse breeders, studbooks and the stallions
- 16. Raising the profile & gaining greater recognition of the WBFSH through new initiatives e.g. develop our presence on social media, and continue to develop the WBFSH website
- 17. Consult with the non-EU studbooks to address issues specific to them and increase their engagement in the federation
- 18. Risk Register: Maintain and review annually during the in-person joint meeting, covering funding risks, political shifts, member disengagement, and reputational issues
