



WBFSH STUDBOOKS JUMPING GLOBAL CHAMPIONS TROPHY

The classes:

- CSIYH 1* – 5 Year Olds* (1.25m)
- CSIYH 1* – 6 Year Olds (1.35m)
- CSIYH 2* – 7 Year Olds (1.40m)
- CSIYH 2* – 8 Year Olds (1.45m)
- CSI 2* – Stallions 9+ years old (1.45m)

*** Horses in the age group of 5YO cannot enter the competition if they competed in the FEI-WBFSH Jumping World Breeding Championships in Lanaken, Belgium.**

The teams:

- All horses are selected by the studbooks.
- Studbooks can enter 1 Team per category with a minimum of 3 horses and a maximum of 6 horses.
- Riders are not allowed to compete for more than 1 Studbook.
- Each Rider can compete for the same Studbook in different categories, with a maximum of 2 horses per category except in the Final, where 3 horses must compete with 3 different riders.
- Change of the rider during the event is not allowed; horses must compete in the 3 competitions with the same rider.

Individual Horses:

Should small studbooks not be able to field a full team, they can select a maximum of 2 horses per category to compete for the individual classification in the same classes as the teams (First and Second Qualifiers). These horses will not compete in the Final, but in the Consolation Final. Individual horses are also subject to studbook selections, as applicable for team horses.

Selections

Horses are selected and nominated by the studbooks themselves. The studbooks determine their own selection procedures. Before the end of May the studbooks submit their entries in principle, but the final selections of horses are carried out by studbooks between June and September.

Competition

- All classes take place in the grass arena.
- There are two Qualifying Rounds, one Consolation Final and one Final for each age group.
- During the Second Qualifier, the horses start in the reverse order of the results of the First Qualifier.
- The Final will be between the best fifteen teams of each category, with only three horses per team, appointed by the team manager.
- In the Final the three horses per team jump in immediate succession of each other.
- All horses that do not qualify for the Final are eligible to compete in the Consolation Final. The Consolation Final is an individual classification, not a team classification.
- The five-year-old horses do not jump against the clock.
